For years now I am dedicated to painting. Painting is my greatest passion. This passion in my life I cannot miss!

I am inspired by landscapes, seascapes, but also faces of -especially old- people. The faces from which life can be read. They move me and invite me to make an imagination.

My seascapes include works that are especially inspired by my stay by the sea on the island Texel. Here I once witnessed a nocturnal flood in springtide, a fantastic experience, the sight of which is to be on my retina for the rest of my life. This experience still inspires me to new seascapes to be painted. It is clear that storm and dark weather by the sea is an inspiring thrill to me.

My landscapes are formed more or less intuitively. I choose a color palette in advance, and let the painting process take place, often without a preconceived plan. As far as I do have a plan, the end result deviates from it quite often. The landscape is more or less depicted by itself. Not until in the final stage, the work requires a more considerated approach. But this is also a jeopardy of losing spontaneity.

Sometimes I paint landscapes in heavy weather, but sunny landscapes and abstract landscapes are to be found in my oeuvre as well. The beautiful scenery of the Wadden Sea islands is a constant source of inspiration. In her latest oeuvre the central focus is on portraits of old people.
